## Personal Integrity as a Christian 1 Thessalonians 2:1-6 — February 18, 2024

introduction: In math, the term "integer" refers to whole numbers (1, 2, 3, etc.) — the opposite of fractions  $(1\frac{1}{2}, 2\frac{3}{4}, \text{ etc.})$ . Integrity refers to wholeness of character — the opposite of hypocrisy.

Personal integrity as a Christian involves:
1. Willingness to suffer for the Lord's sake and to continue to proclaim the gospel boldly (1 Thessalonians 2:1-2)
supporting Scriptures: Acts 17:2-4; 1 Thessalonians 1:9 Acts 16:16-24 — suffering in Philippi Romans 1:16
2. Not spreading error, not having impuremotives or conduct, and not practicing deception (1 Thessalonians 2:3)
supporting Scriptures: 1 Corinthians 15:1, 3-4 Titus 2:7-8
3. Seeking to pleaseGod rather than people (1 Thessalonians 2:4)
supporting Scriptures: 1 Corinthians 4:2 1 Samuel 16:7 Colossians 3:23-24
4. Notflattering others to try to influence them, and not being greedy for financial gain while trying to cover it up (1 Thessalonians 2:5).
supporting Scriptures: 2 Timothy 2:19; Matthew 7:22-23
5. Not seekingglory from others, and not insisting on what you legitimately might be entitled to (1 Thessalonians 2:6)
supporting Scriptures: 1 Corinthians 10:31 1 Timothy 5:17-18 1 Thessalonians 2:9
