Opposition Toward Followers of Jesus 1 Thessalonians 2:14-16 March 24, 2024

introduction: Jesus was betrayed, arrested, put on trial, and crucified. And ever since, there has been opposition — sometimes violent opposition — toward Jesus' followers.

	Opposition as a follower of Jesus should beexpected Thessalonians 2:14):		
	1) expected from whatJesus said when He was on earth (Matthew 5:10-12).		
	2) expected from what was to Jesus; He was brutally executed (Acts 2:22-23).		
	3) expected from what was done to Jesus' _followers in New Testament days.		
	supporting Scriptures: Acts chapter 4 (Peter and John) Acts chapter 5 (all the apostles) Acts chapter 7 (Stephen executed) Acts 8:1, 3 (Saul's persecution)		
	4) expected from what theword of God tells us (1 Timothy 3:12; Philippians 1:29).		
	5) expected from what has been done to Jesus' followers down through the centuries (for example, read <i>Foxe's Book of Martyrs</i>).		
	6) expected from what is being donein our day to Jesus' followers in parts of the world (Hebrews 13:3).
