Out of Sight, But Not Out of Mind 1 Thessalonians 2:17-20 April 7, 2024

Introduction: Sometimes we refer to someone or something as being "out of sight, out of mind." That was not the case with the believers in Thessalonica. They were several hundreds of miles away from Paul, but they were still prominent in his thoughts
1. Satan tries tohinder God's servants from serving Him (1 Thessalonians 2:17-18).
The phrase "having been taken away" is the translation of the Greek word <i>aporphanizo</i> – literally, to be orphaned.
The term "Satan" means "adversary, enemy."
