**God Has Provided the Lamb  
May 5, 2024**

introduction: On the way to offer a sacrifice, Abraham told his son Isaac, “God will provide for Himself the lamb” (Genesis 22:8). God did that, and Abraham renamed the site *Yahweh Yireh* — Hebrew for “the Lord will provide” (Genesis 22:13-14).

God has provided for us an infinitely greater Lamb — the Lord Jesus Christ.

supporting Scriptures: 1 Peter 1:18-21

From Genesis to Revelation, the word of God reveals how He has provided an innocent substitute that was killed to meet the needs of sinful people:

1. \_\_\_\_\_ Eden \_\_\_\_\_ - God Himself killed an innocent animal to provide for the needs of the first man and woman, who had sinned.

2. \_\_\_\_\_ Passover \_\_\_\_\_ - each Israelite family had to kill an innocent lamb to be spared from God’s judgment.

3. the Day of \_\_\_\_\_ Atonement \_\_\_\_\_ - the high priest had to kill an innocent goat to atone for the sins of the entire nation of Israel.

4. \_\_\_\_\_ Calvary \_\_\_\_\_ - the sinless Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, died for the sins of the world.

5. \_\_\_\_\_ eternity \_\_\_\_\_ - “Worthy is the Lamb who was slain!”

personal applications:

1. If you have never done so, repent of your \_\_\_\_\_ sins \_\_\_\_\_ and put your personal faith in the Lord Jesus Christ alone to receive God’s gift of forgiveness of sins and eternal life.
