sermon notes

Formed by God, and Therefore Valuable Psalm 139:13-18 January 19, 2025 — Sanctity of Human Life Sunday

introduction: One factor that makes something valuable is who produced it. For example, at an auction in New York City in 2017, someone paid approximately \$450 million (which includes a commission) for one painting by Leonardo da Vinci.

historical context: On January 22, 1973, the U.S. Supreme Court issued their landmark Roe v. Wade verdict legalizing abortion. A few years later, churches began observing the third Sunday in January — today — as Sanctity of Human Life Sunday.
1. Unborn babies are formed byGod, who knows everything about those unborn babies (Psalm 139:13, 15-18).
supporting Scriptures: Jeremiah 1:4-5 Galatians 1:15
2. Thehuman body is fearfully and wonderfully made by our Creator (Psalm 139:14). For example:
1) Youreyes have taken millions of pictures during your lifetime. One estimate is that the eyes can process about 36,000 bits of information each hour.
2) Yourbrain — the human brain's memory capacity in the average adult can store trillions of bytes of information.
3) Yourheart and circulatory system — electrical impulses keep the heart beating, without being connected to an external power source, and the heart pumps blood through miles and miles of veins, arteries, and capillaries.

3. What can we do to help create a culture of life in our community?
1)Pray(Jeremiah 33:3)
1. Pray for women and girls who are contemplating having an abortion. Pray that they will choose life and give birth.
