sermon notes

God is the Enemy of the Enemy of His People Esther chapter 3 — February 9, 2025

introduction: An ancient proverbs states, "The enemy of my enemy is my friend." Well, God is the enemy of the enemy of His people.
main truth:Opposition to God's people comes, as is evident in Esther chapter 3, but He continues to take care of His people and accomplish His purpose.
historical context: Other examples of attempts to destroy the Jewish people are recorded in:
1) Exodus 1:8-16 — all Hebrewbaby boys were ordered by the Egyptian Pharaoh to be killed.
2) 2 Chronicles 22:10-12 — the royal line ofJesus through the tribe of Judah was murderously reduced by a wicked queen who tried to destroy all the royal heirs — reduced to Joash alone, who was rescued and preserved as a baby.
point to ponder: God's planscannot be stopped. In the book of Esther, all of God's promises to Abraham (Genesis 17:1-8) and David (2 Samuel 7:8-16) were at stake. But God would not allow His chosen people to be completely wiped out, and nothing could prevent God from sending the Messiah to earth.
supporting Scriptures: Job 42:1-2; Isaiah 42:9-10 Revelation 13:8
cultural context: In Bible days, people sometimes utilized "the lot" to seek God's guidance regarding which of two or more possible options should be carried out. The lot was cast in Persia to determine the day when Haman's intended slaughter of the Jews should occur (Esther 3:7). But God used the lot to accomplish His purpose.
supporting Scriptures: Proverbs 16:33 Exodus 23:22
personal applications:
1) Take the properattitude — a Biblical attitude — toward the Jewish people.
supporting Scriptures: Zechariah 2:8 Genesis 12:3
2) Keeptrusting God to take care of you. He is far greater than the opposition and the trouble you face.
supporting Scriptures: 1 John 4:4 Romans 8:3 Hebrews 13:5-6
